Travel Conditions

- COVID-19 travel suspensions still in effect for persons trying to come to the US from <u>China, Iran, Schengen countries of</u> <u>Western Europe, United Kingdom, Ireland, and Brazi</u>l
 - Entry to US not permitted if you were in these countries or regions within the 14 day period prior to attempting entry into the US
 - Includes transit stops
- Non-essential (tourism) travel to US from Canada and Mexico still restricted
 Student travel OK

Travel Conditions

- $^{\circ}$ Still need standard travel documents to enter the US for Fall 2020
 - Unexpired passport
 - F-I entry visa (except Canadian citizens)
 - Form I-20 from Tufts
 - New students should also carry copies of admission letter and financial documents and I-901 SEVIS Fee receipt

• Phased re-opening of US visa services in consulates, will depend on local conditions

July 6, 2020 ICE Guidance – WITHDRAWN!

- Guidance announced on July 6 by Immigration and Customs Enforcement regarding Fall 2020 semester requiring students taking only online classes to leave US
- Challenged in courts by Harvard / MIT, Johns Hopkins, multiple other universities (including Tufts), state of Massachusetts, California, and many more
- Withdrawn by the government on July 14 government has agreed to return us to March 2020 rules
- <u>However</u>: March 2020 rules are very specific to the Spring 2020 semester. Not completely clear how they apply to Fall 2020

Next Steps

- International Center and other schools are working to get some final questions answered from government
- Confirming with each school their plans for the Fall 2020 semester

New Students

- New students i.e., students with no previous F-1 visa history who will be outside the US for Fall 2020 term may take on-line classes, but are not required to do so
- New students cannot come to the US in F-1 status if their programs are online only, even if they have a visa; however they may take on-line classes from home country
- New students who come to the US must take some in-person or hybrid classes and must be full-time
 - Current recommendation: try to limit on-line classes to one class for your first
 9 credits (for graduate students) or 12 credits (for undergraduate students)

Continuing and Transfer Students

- Continuing students can now stay in the US and maintain status through online or a combination of on-line and in-person/hybrid courses
- Continuing students taking full-time remote classes outside the US will be maintained in active status for return in Spring or later
 - ° Students who are taking a leave of absence will have SEVIS records deactivated
- Transfer students inside the US will be able to complete the F-I transfer to Tufts for Fall 2020 as long as you are enrolled full-time, regardless of course modality

Updated I-20 Forms – No Longer Needed

- July 6 guidance said that schools must reissue new I-20s to all students applying for visas or coming (back) to the US
- The requirement has been eliminated now that the July 6 guidance was withdrawn
- However, some embassies already put into operation the July 6 guidance, it will take them a few days to catch up

Students on Study / Research Abroad

 Continuing students engaged in Tufts study abroad programs or graduate students who are doing research abroad during Fall 2020 will have SEVIS record maintained in active status

F-1 Enrollment Requirements

- Continuing students must still enroll full-time for Fall 2020 to maintain F-1 status and keep their SEVIS records in active status
 - Continuing students taking classes outside the US waiting for more specific processing instructions from the government
- Students can still request reduced course load, if inside the US, for the following reasons (see <u>https://icenter.tufts.edu/f1-reduced-courseload</u>)
 - First semester academic difficulties
 - Final semester (cannot take only on-line classes)
 - Medical condition (requires recommendation from medical doctor)

OPT / CPT Timeline

- $^{\circ}$ OPT and CPT eligibility require two consecutive semesters of full-time study I the US
- New students who do not arrive until Spring 2021 will not start the "Practical Training" clock until Spring 2021
- Continuing students may include Fall 2020 as one semester even if studying / researching outside the US, as long as registered full-time
